# Indian Health Service (IHS) - Overview

The Indian Health Service (IHS) is a federal program that provides health care to American Indians and Alaska Natives (AI/ANs). It offers medical services through hospitals, clinics, and other facilities across the U.S.

## Who is eligible?

You may qualify for IHS services if you are:

- · A member of a federally recognized American Indian or Alaska Native tribe
- · A descendant of a tribe and meet certain criteria
- · Eligible through special treaties, laws, or agreements

Some non-Native people may also receive IHS care in limited cases, such as pregnant women carrying an AI/AN child or non-Native family members of eligible patients.

#### What does IHS cover?

IHS provides basic health care services, including:

- O Doctor visits & hospital care
- Preventive care (vaccines, screenings)
- Dental & vision services
- Mental health & substance abuse treatment
- Prescription medications
- Emergency medical servicess

### Important notes

- IHS is not health insurance. It provides care at IHS-run facilities, but services may be limited based on funding
  and availability.
- Many Al/ANs also enroll in Medicaid, Medicare, or private insurance to cover additional health care needs.
- If IHS facilities can't provide needed care, patients may be referred to outside providers through the Purchased/Referred
   Care (PRC) program, but this is not guaranteed due to funding limits.
